

Founder CHPD and globally renowned Leadership and Organizational Development Guru, Dr. Tony Cockerill to visit India

To lead a series of seminars in Mumbai and New Delhi

New Delhi, August 27, 2008: Dr. Tony Cockerill, the globally renowned Leadership and Organizational Development Guru, and Founder of CHPD UK (Centre ^{for} High Performance Development), will be visiting India between September 14-20th.

As a part of his visit, InspireOne has partnered with the National HRD Network to host special presentations by Dr. Cockerill in Delhi and Mumbai on: **High Performance Leadership: Rapid Development and Deployment Across Organizations.**

Owing to accelerated pace of growth in the Indian economy, people have been catapulted into roles because of need rather than their ability to perform. As a result, Leadership Development has become a significant need in the corporate sector and the presentation will address the challenges in the Indian context.

Dr. Cockerill BA (Hons), MSc, PhD, Cert Ed, FRSA is globally recognised as a leading expert in leadership, team and organisational development. Whilst at the London Business School he led major international research into the characteristics that distinguish leaders, teams and organisations which perform to outstanding levels in dynamic and competitive environments.

Working with his research partners in the US and drawing upon primary research into leadership competency and development Dr. Cockerill founded the CHPD in 1995. It was established to apply the research, which Dr. Cockerill had led, to organisations across the world. He provides direction to CHPD's ongoing research programme, which includes the identification of High Potential Leaders, the development of High Performing Cross-Cultural Teams and Diversity in Leadership. He also devotes time in conducting workshops and consulting in various industries including financial services, healthcare, government, communications and transportation.

His key areas of expertise include:

- Development of high performance behavioural models
- Design and implementation of leadership assessment and development processes
- Organisational strategy creation
- Executive team development
- Validation of leadership methodology

His PhD research into the leadership behaviors has helped CHPD to emerge as the top leadership development organisation globally. The research underpins superior performance - Leadership Behaviour Associated with Organisational Performance (1992). A summary of key aspects of the research was published in the London Business School's Business Strategy Review - Managerial Competencies: Fact or Fiction (1995). Since then, he has become a global personality in leadership and organisational development.

He would be reaching India on September 14, 2008 and will leave on September 20, 2008.
